EBBA Annual Conference April 11,12,13, 1997 Cape Charles, Virginia

This year's annual conference will be held in a unique natural wonderland. Cape Charles is best described as a "Cape May" without the development. With a natural necklace of barrier islands, the Eastern Shore of Virginia terminates at Cape Charles. Here the waters of the Atlantic Ocean and the Chesapeake Bay blend their respective treasures. Cape Charles is also a migratory bottleneck second to none.

The conference will be hosted by the Sunset Beach Inn. The Inn has a private white sand beach on the Chesapeake Bay and is noted for spectacular sunsets. This property adjoins the Eastern Shore of Virginia National Wildlife Refuge. There is a good restaurant and lounge on site. For those who might prefer to bring an RV, Sunset Beach Inn also has an RV campground with full hook-ups (including satellite TV) available on the property. The lobby has a gift shop stocked with Eastern Shore gifts and birding merchandise. There is even a boat ramp available to guests of the Inn providing access to the Bay and the Atlantic.

A 375 acre park on the shore of the Chesapeake Bay with a well-kept campground. Tent sites are \$14.00, RV with water and electric \$18.00 and RV with full hook-ups \$20.00 (price includes satellite TV hook-ups). Nice trails with elevated boardwalks over the dune areas. How to Get There

From the north: You may take I-95(quickest) or route 13 (most scenic). Sunset Beach Inn is located on route 13 just north of the toll booths for the Chesapeake Bay Bridge Tunnel. If traveling I-95, exit onto 1-295 just north of Richmond. Then take I-64 east toward Virginia Beach. After crossing the Hampton Roads Tunnel proceed approximately ten miles and exit onto route 13 north. This will take you to the Chesapeake Bay Bridge Tunnel (\$10.00 toll). This bridge is 17.6 miles long! The Sunset Beach Inn is located on the left just past the toll plaza.

From the west: I-64 to route 13 north. Then follow the directions as listed above.

From the south: I-95 to Emporia, Virginia, turn east onto route 58. Follow route 58 to I-64 toward Virginia Beach. Exit onto route 13 north (beyond the VA Beach exits) and then follow the directions as listed above.

Air Connections



Norfolk International Airport is the most convenient airport. NIA is located only 9 miles from the Chesapeake Bay Bridge Tunnel.
