Excerpts from Minutes of EBBA's 75th Annual Meeting held 17-19 April 1998 at Villa Maria Center, Erie, Pennsylvania

President's Report: President Earl Hodnett announced that representatives from both EBBA and WBBA have been invited to a joint banding meeting in Indianapolis, Indiana, in fall 1998, hosted by IBBA and the Assoc. of Field Ornithologists. He also encouraged present members to become more actively involved in the association and encouraged everyone to solicit new members.

Treasurer's Report: Treasurer Don Mease reported that income for the past fiscal year covered expenses; that the Memorial Grant Fund monies come from life membership payments and contributions which are invested; and the Frazier Fund income comes from donations and the proceeds of the bucket raffle.

Mist Net Committee: Gale Smith reported he was still having communications problems with our net supplier in Japan. He has Japanese nets for sale in other than 12 m lengths. He also has Taiwanese nets for sale which are the same type available from Spidertech in Finland.

Membership: Elaine Mease reported that EBBA has added 24 new members in the past year for a current total of 476 members.

Editor: Robert Pantle made an appeal for articles for *NABB* and also requested line drawings. He also reported that the three editors and the literature review editor of *NABB* are working on changes to the format for manuscripts. These changes will be published in the Suggestions to Authors section when agreed upon.

Historian: Brad Silfies reported that he has received a request for founding information about EBBA for a chapter in a proposed volume on Contributions to the History of North American Ornithology. He has requested any historical material about EBBA be sent to him (address on inside front cover).

MEMORIAL GRANT 1998 AWARDS


Two applications were received and reviewed for the 1998 grant awards. Each applicant has finished his masters program recently, with several publications, and has started the Ph.D. program at another institution. Both were awarded grants for 1998.

Robert J. Smith of Mount Olive, MS, received his grant for his project "Resource Dynamics and Early Spring Arrival of Nearctic-Neotropical Migrant Landbirds Along the Northern Lake Huron Shoreline." This project will evaluate the use and importance of chironiomids and other available arthropods to American Redstarts and other warblers arriving at their northerly breeding grounds in early spring.

Gregory A. Jones of Gainesville, FL, received his grant for "Assessment of Avian Interaction with Citrus Production in Florida: Enhancing the Agroecosystem Balance." This three-year project will study the effects of wild bird management on the productivity and sustainability of agriculture and in the maintenance of ecological integrity and biodiversity in modern agroecosystems.
