GREAT GRAY OWL SURVEY

SWAINSON'S HAWK SURVEY

The California Department of Fish and Game and the U.S. Bureau of Land Management have undertaken a cooperative study of the Swainson's Hawk in California to document distribution, abundance, habitat requirements, and reproductive success. Populations have been extirpated from some regions of the state and have declined drastically in others. Information concerning sightings of these hawks would be greatly appreciated. Please include your name, address, and phone number; precise location of where the hawks were observed (ideally a map insert should be provided); and the date. Public input into this survey will greatly increase the effectiveness of the study and assist State and Federal agencies in developing a protection and management program for the species.
