Bill Baggs Cape Florida State Park banding station did not operate in spring 2012, and Kestrel Haven did not band either, primarily due to a feral cat that was decimating birds on the sanctuary but could not be trapped.

Numbers were down at half of the reporting stations – significantly down at Long Point, Presque Isle and Powdermill. It was not for lack of effort; birds per 100 net hours (b/100nh) were down at every station with the exception of Lewiston and Patuxent.

Braddock Bay, Long Point, Powdermill and Penn State's Arboretum opened in March. Powdermill documented record early arrivals of five species.

Should the stations that are able to be flexible in start/stop dates make an effort to begin spring monitoring earlier?

Long-distance re-encounters are always noteworthy. A Swainson's Thrush banded at Presque Isle's Erie Bluffs State Park in 2009 was recaptured in Veracruz, Mexico, on 21 Apr 2012.

Friends and family of Bob McKinney gathered at Braddock Bay Bird Observatory on 6 May 2012 to dedicate the Robert G. McKinney Bird Banding Laboratory in Bob's memory.

As always, we would welcome the participation of additional reporting stations for the spring AFR report. Let me know if you are interested, and I will send you a reporting form.

The 2012 spring Crown Point Banding Station began operations on 4 May, continuing until the afternoon of 20 May. This was the 37<sup>th</sup> consecutive year of operation on the grounds of the 360-ac Crown Point State Historic Site. The Crown Point Banding Association (CPBA) operates the station through an agreement with the New York State Office of Parks, Recreation and Historic Preservation. The station is located on the Crown Point Peninsula - Lake Champlain - west of His Majesty's Fort in the hawthorn-juniper thickets. Banders participating this spring were: Ted Hicks, Gordon Howard, Gary Lee, Melanie McCormack, Catherine Pohl, Nina Schoch, and Robert Wei.

The station banded four new species this year, bringing the total number of species banded to 105 since the station's inception in 1976. New species banded this year included Northern Rough-winged Swallow, Red-bellied Woodpecker, and female Cerulean Warbler (banded on 11 May) which was the first observed Cerulean on the Crown Point
